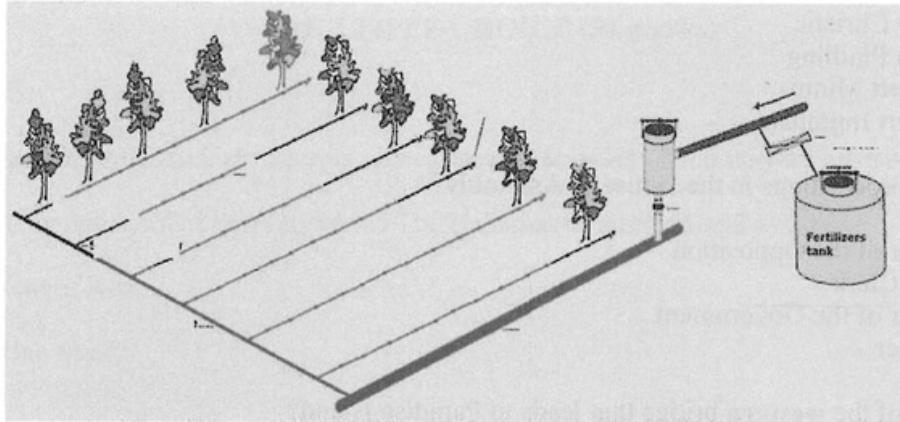

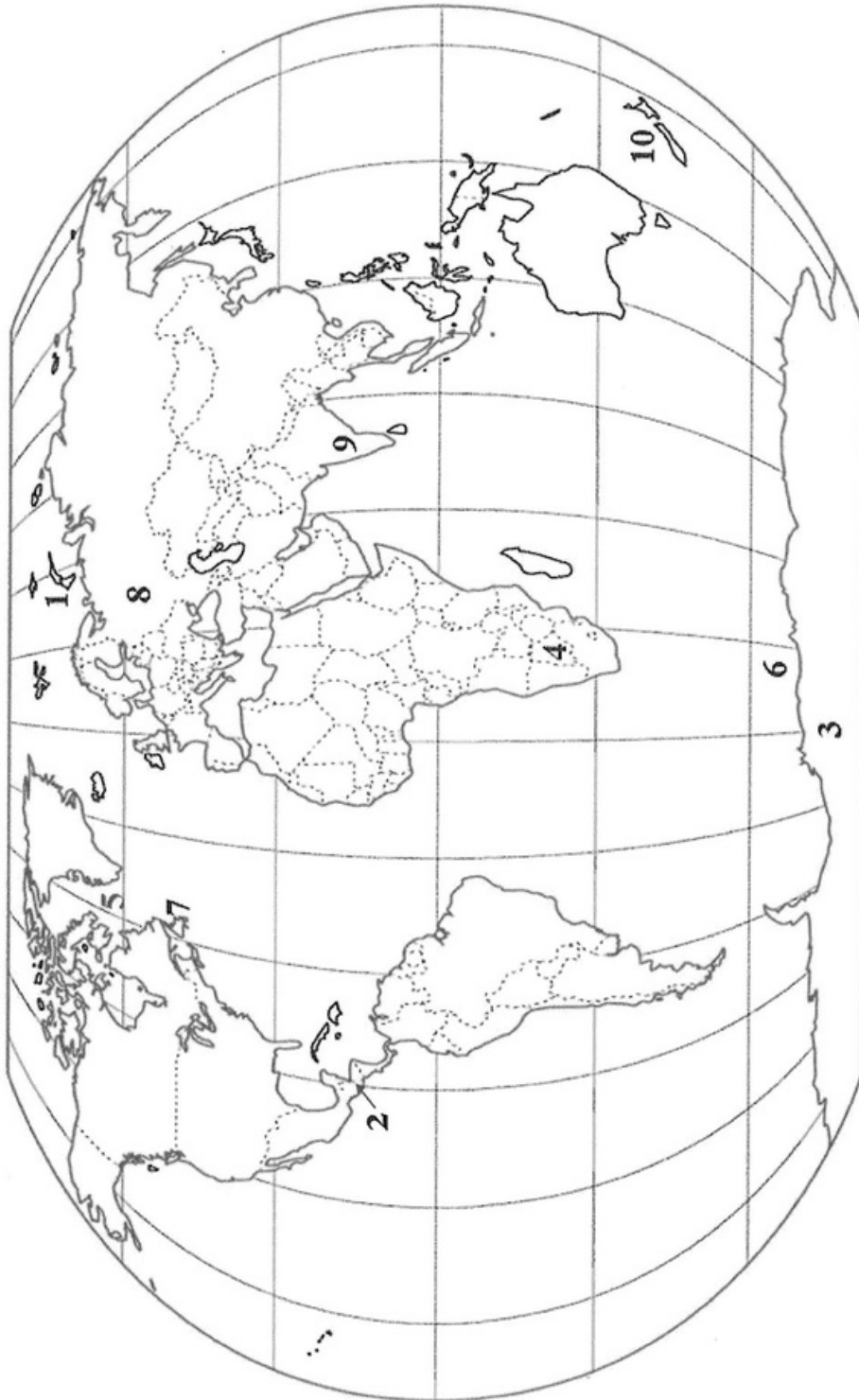

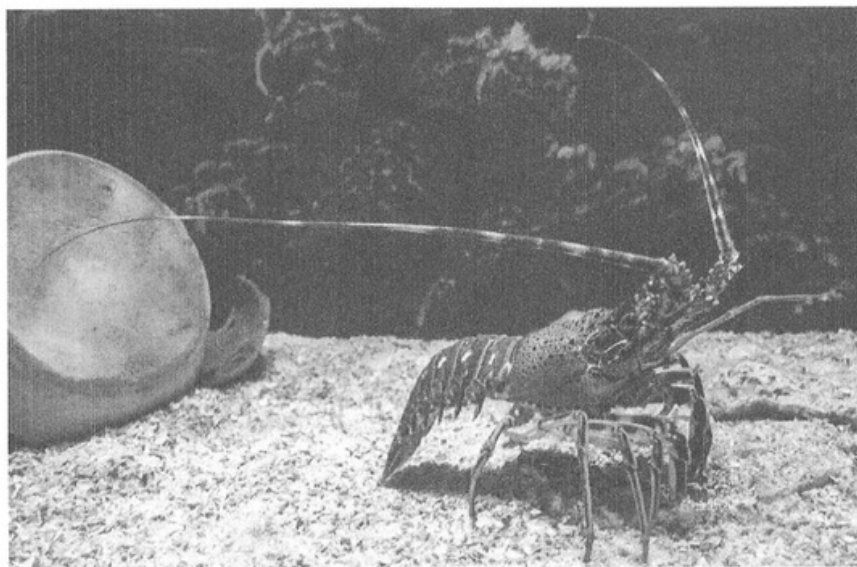
QUESTION D (I) – Fishing in The Bahamas

One of the biggest problems with fishing is that the technology is too good, and fishermen can catch fish faster than they can replace themselves. The result will be the loss of groupers first, a fish that is now fished out throughout nearly all the Caribbean region except The Bahamas. Conch is likely to be next, and this has also been fished out in the Florida Keys and the Virgin Islands, so it encourages a lot of poaching from our neighbours. Lobsters will probably be the last to go, but in the end all will be lost unless some equally modern method is used to protect young fish and shellfish while they grow into adults.

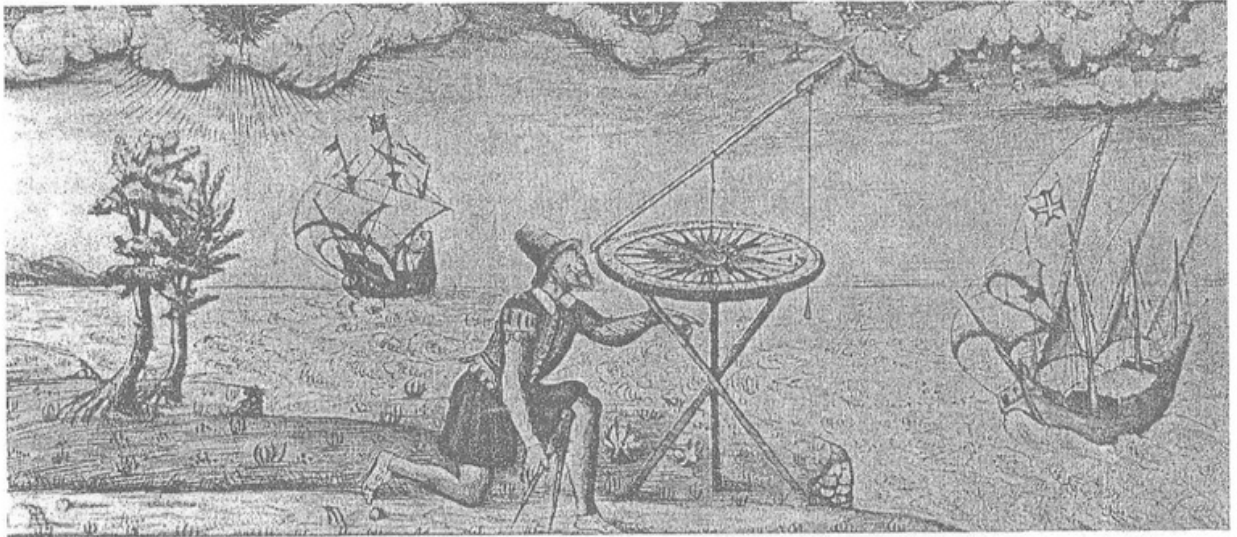

Imagine that a ship travelling from Barbados to the United Kingdom (UK) starts to sink in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean, and that its captain sends out a radio message asking for help. When they hear this message, the captains of other ships in that part of the ocean will want to go to the aid of the sinking vessel. But how will they know where to find it since it is highly unlikely they will be near enough to be able to see it? The captain of the sinking ship must help them by giving its position. This will usually be done by telling them its latitude and its longitude. Lines of latitude and longitude are drawn on maps. These lines make it possible for us to fix the position of any place on the map.

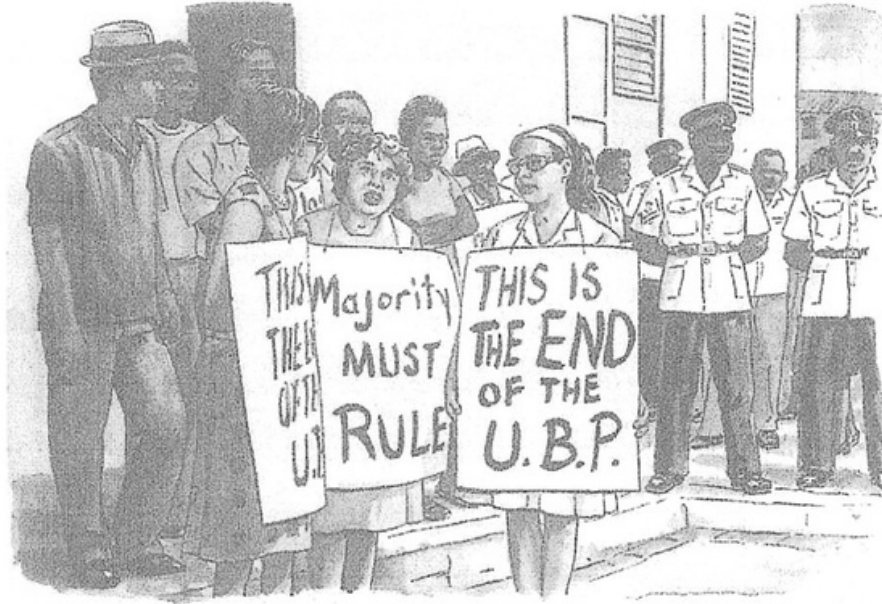
